Chairman's Update

In our Spring Newsletter we reported that we had just been hit by the COVID virus restrictions and like everyone else, had to close with no idea of what was in store. Six months later and we've been unable to do virtually anything that we had planned for 2020.

Our professionally produced 'Southam Bobbies' exhibition opened in January, but had to be curtailed. This was very disappointing after the fantastic support we had received from the Warwickshire Constabulary Local History group.

Our planned Summer exhibition on "Southam after WW2" had to be abandoned, and we were unable to present any talks about local history, or organise any outreach activities. One by one, all the town's normal events were cancelled, which meant no opportunities to attend them and raise funds.

However, we have been slowly adapting to the new environment in various ways. One thing we have done is develop our skills in 'virtual' communication. We have continued to hold Management and Trustee meetings using 'Zoom' which presented some challenges, but nothing insurmountable. Secondly, we have started to produce more videos that can be posted online on YouTube.



We also participated in both the online Leamington Local History day and the virtual Southam Book Festival, by making existing and new videos available. The new Book Festival video was well received and involved 5 volunteers talking about the various books that we have on sale. We are now working on a new video about the naming of Tithe Lodge and Tithe Place and the discoveries made during its construction – all these videos will be available to view via our web site.

Although we had to suspend volunteer activities within Tithe Place, we have carried on working from home on various projects. We were pleased that our regular volunteers were keen to get back to work, and we've had enquiries from new people including one lady, who is interested in helping us to acquire official museum accreditation status.

Following an appeal by our Treasurer, Stratford District Council has been very understanding in waiving the rent on our Tithe Place rooms whilst the café and Library were closed and we could not comply with Government guidelines on making our rooms Covid-secure. We are hoping that they will continue to support us until we can be fully operational again.

The Library started to provide a limited service in September, and the café re-opened in early October. In order to generate some income, (and after carrying out the necessary risk assessment and purchasing various anti-viral supplies,) we have now resumed some activities at Tithe Place.

Footfall remains low, however, and the closure of the Tuesday market was a huge blow for the town. It used to draw large numbers of people in which was a great benefit to us.

At this time of year we normally hope to raise a substantial amount by selling our Heritage Calendar,



Christmas cards, Raffle tickets and books.

So the good news is, we are now open again, (for sales only,) on Thursday and Saturday mornings from 10am until 12 noon.

We look forward to seeing you!

Southam Heritage Collection (incorporating the Cardall Collection and Alan Griffin photographic archive) comprises artefacts, documents, photographs and memorabilia associated with Southam and its surrounding villages. The County Museum Service inspectors agree that it is an important record of the life and times of our historic market town. The Collection is housed at Tithe Place in the centre of Southam, where it can be displayed, used and appreciated by the general public, local history societies, schools, reminiscence groups and researchers.

All of the Committee and three Officers have agreed to stand again for another year, and the Annual Accounts for the year ending 31st August have been audited, showing a slight increase in our


overall income, particularly from business sponsorship.

In addition, Southam Post Office has again agreed to sell the calendars on our behalf, and pass on all the sales proceeds to us.





Our 2020 Christmas Card

For the fourth year running, our Treasurer Pam has painted a wintery scene of an iconic Southam building to be used as our exclusive Christmas card. This year it features St James Parish Church, its lychgate, and the original avenue of lime trees.

The design was inspired by Alan Griffin's article 'A Chorister Looks Back', written in 2016. The article is available to read on the Southam History / Cardall's Corner tab of our website.



In his article, Alan describes how Southam St James had a thriving church choir from the 1940s to 1960s. The era depicted on the card is the 1950s, with choir boys and musicians hurrying to Church for practice. The avenue of limes was planted to celebrate the defeat of Napoleon at the Battle of Waterloo in 1815.

The cards are unique to us, A5 size and are available to buy at just £1.50 each. Cards from previous years (featuring The Craven Arms, The Tithe Barn and The Olde Mint) are also still available to buy.

Heritage Open Days

Supported by the National Trust and People's Postcode Lottery, annually during September, Heritage Open Days (HODs) are England's largest festival of history and culture. Venues across the country open their doors to celebrate their heritage, community and history for free, and SHC have joined in during recent years by doing town history walks.

This year, despite Covid-19 problems, we again took part. On September 18th, 19th and 20th, we organised a full weekend of walks around the town centre exploring the town's history. Visitors came from as far away as Coventry and Northampton joining our local history enthusiasts.

After an introductory walk with Linda as a guide, they were given a selection of local history leaflets to use for a longer self-guided walk, either then or later, or to read over coffee in town.

Next year's HODs is from 10th to 19th September and (all being well) we will once again present guided town history walks. If you are a newcomer to Southam, or would simply like to find out more about your town, please make a note of the date if you would like to join us.

One of the things we try to monitor is just how many people are following Southam Heritage activities. However, from October to December we will be opening for sales only on Thursday and Saturday mornings from 10am to 12 noon. We are not able to present large scale exhibitions at present, but we do have two large exterior windows with heritage displays that are regularly updated.
