#### Chairman's Update

We're now well into 2025 and Spring is changing into Summer so it's time to update everyone on how we're coping in our 7<sup>th</sup> year at Tithe Place.

Through good fortune we were able to acquire two rooms in Tithe Place – one exclusively devoted to exhibitions and associated activity, and one providing secure storage and working space for our constantly increasing collection.

We now have over 9,500 items indexed and scanned or photographed, together with over 4,000 photos plus nearly 500 glass slides from the early 1900's and over 3,000 local newspaper cuttings. Quite a change from the 2,500 items we believed were contained in the Collection when we took it over from Rene Cardall back in 2005! There are still many more items to be catalogued, and we continue to receive new and fascinating items from local folk as they discover them.

The one major dark moment during these past 6 months was of course the very sad and unexpected



death of Linda Doyle literally just after Christmas. Linda had been a founder member of the Collection back in 2005 and over the years as she retired took on a larger and larger role in the running of the Collection. She has left an enormous hole in terms of

the work she undertook and the responsibility she happily assumed. We are struggling to cope without her and are desperately looking for one or more persons to assume her responsibilities. If you know of anyone who might be interested, please encourage them to have a chat with us.

#### Management Changes

With the death of Linda and, earlier in 2024, the death of Rowan Parker we found ourselves short

of Trustees and members of our Management Committee. Our Constitution, which is a legal document lodged with the Charity Commission, requires we have a minimum of three trustees, but we were left with only two – myself and Peter Rollins. Fortunately, at a meeting held early in the New Year ClIrs Lee Ellard and Ron Hind both agreed to become Trustees. Both have been members of the Collection for several years now, Lee on the Management Committee and Ron as a volunteer working in the Project Room, and we welcome them to the Management Committee.

We were also able to fill several of the spaces on the Management Committee with Ron Hind and Lynda Pease both agreeing to join.

#### Volunteers

Linda Doyle filled many roles in the Collection, especially in regard to the Display Room. She managed this room on a day by day basis and also did all the forward planning for Exhibitions and interfacing with other people and groups who wanted to use the facility.

Word about Linda's misfortune spread rapidly and much to our surprise a number of people came forward to offer their services. By the end of January we had four new people come on board – three of them for the Display Room and one for the Exhibition Room. This means we now have two people available for each morning that the Display Room is open, apart from one morning each fortnight and we have been able to start cataloguing the 3,300+ local newspaper cuttings which we have had for the best part of ten years now without any real knowledge about the subjects they covered.

In addition, we have another young lady volunteer to look at how we use social media, and Facebook in particular. She is also completing a Master's degree in history, so she has an inbuilt interest in our area of work and hopefully will revitalise our social media presence.

So, all in all, it would seem we are not doing too badly after Linda's death. She took responsibility for all our Displays, and she initiated and executed

the ideas and projects to promote the Collection to the public. We are still looking for one or more people to take on these management tasks.

#### 200 Club Update

Our 200 Club is a key source of revenue for the Collection and while providing us with a significant proportion of the funds we need to keep the Collection going, it also provides participants with an opportunity to win double the price of their ticket



each month and £50 every 6 months. As we approach the end of May Sue Nason will be starting to follow up on ticket renewals for people who aren't paying via a standing order. We would obviously like to sell more tickets this year if possible.

Although the year for the 200 Club starts in June you can buy a £5

The first £10 prize draw for the 2025/6 year will take place at the end of June with the first £50 draw taking place at the end of November. Quite a few of our supporters have bought tickets as a small present for their grandchildren either as a reward for some special achievement or as a birthday gift – would you like to do the same?



#### Spring Exhibition

Before her death Linda had drawn up the plans for the Display Room in 2025 and the first exhibition was to feature the 1913 Almanack for Southam.



This publication printed in Southam and focussing on shops tradesmen and operating in the town. included lt many adverts (with some interesting items being sold) - would you imagine "hand sewn boots made to order" being offered in Leamington Road, or going to your local

Coal merchant to hire a Marquee? It also contained very detailed and sometimes surprising information about organisations and key people in Southam and all the surrounding villages. Did you know Southam had a Debating Society? The second half of the Almanack covers topics of a countrywide perspective. This Exhibition, including a copy of the Almanack for you to read, will be on show untill the Warwickshire Open Studies event that starts on June 21st.

#### Southam Lions

Each year Southam Lions run a fund raising event on the May bank Holiday Monday at the Bowling Green Inn. We like to support the Lions in the tremendous work they do in raising funds for local charities, and indeed we have benefitted from these in years gone by. We normally run a Tombola for this event. Usually Linda would take care of this event finding and collecting all the prizes, labeling them up with tickets and then manning the stall on the day.



This year we were lucky to have the wife of one of our members offer to take on the role in Linda's place. It was a lovely day spoilt only slightly by what seemed like at times. hurricane force winds. We were quite concerned that our gazebo

might actually take off and we would be running down Welsh Road trying to recapture it. In the end it turned out to be a great success, both for us and for the Lions with a massive number of people attending and we raised £160 for the Collection.

#### VE Day - 80th Anniversary

It seems only yesterday when we were commemorating the First World War centenary but this year the focus has been, for the first time, on a very significant event in the Second World War

when Germany surrendered to the Allied Forces. Very few of those who were serving in the Allied forces at that time are still alive and it was decided that the country should make concerted effort to commemorate the



event in a coordinated manner by lighting a peace candle or beacon at 9:15 on the evening of May 8th.

In support of this commemoration the Collection was asked to find documents and items relating to WW2 and to display them at a Mother's Union afternoon tea party and the Town Annual General Meeting, Mayor Making and Peace Candle lighting all to be held in St James Church on May 8<sup>th</sup>.

We were delighted to be able to support these events.

In addition we displayed other WW2 related posters together with the Union flag and bunting in our High Street windows.

# Warwickshire Open Studios Arts & Crafts Trail 2025

Following on from the success of last year we will be supporting the annual Arts and Crafts trail which

has been going on for many years Warwickshire. Southam has had very little participation until recently, but last year was a big success and we had a large number of visitors, many of whom came from faraway places and who never seen our exhibitions before or even knew of our existence.



The exhibition will again cover two weeks and three weekends over a fortnight from June 21<sup>st</sup> through to July 6<sup>th</sup> inclusive.

#### Summer Exhibition

Following on from our participation in the Warwickshire Open Studios event we are planning to re-run an Exhibition which was originally planned for 2020 but which had to be taken down when covid lockdowns came into force only two weeks after the opening.

We had worked with the Warwickshire Constabulary History Group and the Exhibition and Displays were a joint effort. We have been fortunate to re-establish contact with the two men who were involved previously and they have agreed to help us in the same way as five years ago. So we're looking forward to a very interesting exhibition.

#### The Southam Timeline

For some time, we have had a permanent display in place around the upper part of the Exhibition Room walls, describing significant dates in the history of Southam.

We are now producing a book entitled 'Southam - The Timeline of a Rural Warwickshire Town' which will expand on the information in the Timeline display, by providing much more detail about the town's history. We hope this book will become the definitive guide to the history of Southam and will be an interesting read for anyone who wants to know more about our town. It will be printed and available later this year.
